The Resurrection of Our Lord

Grace to you and peace from God our Creator and the Lord Jesus Christ, our redeemer. Amen.

We recently celebrated Easter Sunday. The liturgical name for the celebration is The Resurrection of Our Lord. Each Sunday in the church year is a celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. That is one reason why the 40 days of Lent do not include Sundays.

Early in the first century believers in Jesus gathered on the first day of the week for worship because that was the day Jesus was raised. It was servants like the women and men who followed Jesus that experienced the Resurrection. They passed on the story from person to person, community to community. Those who were following "The Way" (how early followers of Jesus were described) began to have the identity of a type of community that acted differently than the world. It is said during the first century that those outside the Christian faith would look at this new community and say, "My, how they love each other".

We believe that the Holy Spirit led and guided the early church and we still believe the Holy Spirit guides us today. May God lead us to be the kind of community that gathers in the name of Jesus in such a way that others will say, "My, how they love each other".

Your check or cash provide the total, but the offering and the envelope are then kept separate so funds can be deposited at the bank and data from the envelope can be entered into the computer in the church office.

It is also a help if you put your offering envelope number on your check. These small but very important steps are super helpful!

Theology 101

Recently a class met for two consecutive Mondays to discuss some basic concepts of Theology and here are some reflections...

- 1. To even *think* about "studying" God is something that must be approached with the humblest of hearts.
- There have been many attempts by church thinkers to prove that God exists. Some are more persuasive than others. (If interested, Google "Proofs of God".)
- God reveals God's self to the world *generally* as through nature. The Psalmist writes, "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of God's hands". In the beauty of creation you can see God at work..
- 4. God reveals God's self in a *special* way. God comes to God's people in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and it is the Holy Spirit that enables us to believe.

April 1 - April Fools' Day. Although its origin is unclear, this day is when people play pranks on each other. Some nationwide media organizations get in the spirit as well, such as when Google said you could play Pan Man on Google Maps!

April 22 - Earth Day; created on this day in 1970, this annual event demonstrates support for environmental protection and in December of 1970 led to the establishment of the Environmental Protection Agency in this country. Also, Passover begins at sundown on this date.

Although not observed as a public holiday, it is always celebrated on the Wednesday of the last full week of April. Administration includes a wide variety of duties including office management, answering the phone, clerical work, and record maintenance.

QUESTIONS ABOUT GIVING BLOOD ...

- 1. Am I too old to give blood? There is no upper age limit for blood donation.
- 2. Who can donate?
 - a. Donors must be at least 16 years-old, weigh at least 110* pounds and feel well and healthy.
 - b. Tattoos are acceptable if done in a Nevada retail establishment and have healed (usually 2-3 weeks after applied).
 - c. Donors cannot be taking antibiotics for at least 48-hours prior to the blood drive.

d. For questions about donor eligibility, please contact Vitalant at 877-258-4825 or visit www.vitalant.org/eligibility.

- e. For an updated list of medications that may prevent you from giving blood, please visit www.vitalant.org/health.
- 3. April is National Donate Life Month and blood donations are a vital part of the organ transplant process before, during surgery and throughout the recovery process. One blood donation can save up to three lives!
- 4. Donors can schedule an appointment to GIVE BLOOD at <u>www.donors.vitalant.org and search for available times with blood</u> <u>drive code: 10054966 or contact Vitalant at 877-258-4825 for</u> <u>assistance!</u> Appointments are encouraged; walk-ins are always welcome! Bring photo identification and invite others to join you in saving lives!
