Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

The season of Lent, *is a time of repentance,* fasting, *and preparation for the coming of the Easter season. It is a time of self-examination and reflection.*

One person told me they grew up in a church that did not highlight liturgical seasons but now, as an adult, they have discovered the season of Lent, which they admit, makes them think more soberly (clearly) about their daily life.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday reminding us of this little detail: *we don't have all the time in the world*. **"Remember that you are dust and to dust you will return."** That is the phrase spoken when ashes are imposed in the sign of the cross on your forehead. No, we don't have all the time in the world so Lent calls us to focus on the basics.

- 1. We are children of our loving God who stand in need of God's forgiveness each day.
- We can look to all kinds of things to save us, but it is the cross through which we see and experience the love and grace of God ... that is where our salvation is signified.
- Our repentance ... prayer, fasting, and almsgiving ... is not intended to make us better, but more aware of our need for God.

By the way, don't get stressed out if you choose to give up something for Lent and it doesn't go so well. That's the whole point. We rely on God's strength, not our own.

Being Good Neighbors

As I have been reading *The Science of the Good Samaritan* for the Thursday book group, I've been thinking about what it means to be a good neighbor. Our donations are a great start. Thank you not only for the Souperbowl of Caring donations, but also for the regular food and clothing donations you give in addition to your regular offerings! But there's more to being a good neighbor than just donating.

Some of you have heard me tell the story of a community gifting a houseless man a bicycle and a pair of boots. He hadn't asked for either and, to be blunt, he didn't really want either gift (to him they were simply stuff that he needed to manage), but someone took a picture and it was put in the local newspaper as a "feel good" story. After that, behind the scenes, a member of the community used his connections to find the man's son, who had lost touch with him many years earlier. There was soon a great reunion (not pictured in the newspaper). Soon afterwards, the man moved out of the community and into his son's home.

Being a good neighbor often means taking the time to listen to the needs of others because they are not always the same. In other words, put yourself in the place of your neighbor. Some people need bicycles and boots, some people need food and clothing, some people need help completing complicated forms, some people need vocational training, some people need a friend.

Your check or cash provide the total, but the offering and the envelope are then kept separate so funds can be deposited at the bank and data from the envelope can be entered into the computer in the church office.

It is also a help if you put your offering envelope number on your check. These small but very important steps are super helpful!

Theology 101

Recently a class met for two consecutive Mondays to discuss some basic concepts of Theology and here are some reflections...

- 1. To even *think* about "studying" God is something that must be approached with the humblest of hearts.
- There have been many attempts by church thinkers to prove that God exists. Some are more persuasive than others. (If interested, Google "Proofs of God".)
- God reveals God's self to the world *generally* as through nature. The Psalmist writes, "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of God's hands". In the beauty of creation you can see God at work..
- 4. God reveals God's self in a *special* way. God comes to God's people in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and it is the Holy Spirit that enables us to believe.




FBI Extends Resources to Faith Communities Amid Rising Election-Year Tensions

In a proactive move to address concerns during election years, the FBI has extended its resources and support to the Office of the Bishop, highlighting the unfortunate trend of increased hate crimes during these periods. With a commitment to safeguarding civil rights and ensuring the safety and dignity of all individuals, the FBI offers comprehensive guides on hate crimes, federal civil rights statutes, and international human rights violations.

Community members are urged to report hate crimes or any criminal activity directly to the FBI via 1-800-CALL-FBI or online at tips.fbi.gov, and for internet-related crimes, at www.ic3.gov. For emergencies, dialing 911 remains the immediate course of action. This collaboration underscores the FBI's dedication to combating hate and fostering a safe and inclusive environment for all, especially in times of heightened political activity.

MARCH 2024 IS NATIONAL KIDNEY MONTH. The theme for education this year is "Get to know your Kidneys," sponsored by the National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases (NIDDK).Griffin P. Rodgers, M.D. (Director of NIDDK) stated: "NIDDK research creates knowledge about treatments for diseases that are among the most chronic, costly, and consequential for patients, their families, and the nation."

Here are some facts:

Symptoms of Kidney Disease often include: swelling of the hands, face, abdomen, ankles, or feet. Blood in the urine, foamy urine, puffy eyes, painful or difficult

Urination, increased thirst, and fatigue. You may have some but not all of these symptoms. You kidneys filter urine 25 times per day, regulate fluid levels, activate Vitamin D for healthy bones,

filter wastes from your blood, directs production of red blood cells, regulates blood pressure, and helps keep blood minerals in balance.

Do not hesitate to contact your heath care provider if your are experiencing any of the symptoms. Take a deep breath, pray and breathe there are lots of things you can do to keep your kidneys functioning.

MINDFULNESS MOMENT: MEDITATION TO RELIEVE STRESS

With so much going on in the world around us, it is easy to be stressed out and overwhelmed. Each of us have burdens we are carrying and sometimes they feel too heavy to bear.

While we may not have the power to change our situation, we do have the power to change our perspective of the situation. Taking time for a mindfulness moment can help bring about the change in perspective we so desperately need.


Today, take some time even if it's just 5 minutes to find a comfortable position, close your eyes and breathe. If you find yourself starting to think of the list of things you need to get done or feel yourself worrying about the issues in the world, take a breath and focus on your breathing.

When I am having a difficult time, I simply breathe in (through my nose) for a count of 4 and breathe out (through my mouth) for a count of 4.

Try it! Breath in 1 - 2 - 3 - 4 Breath out 4 - 3 - 2 -1

As you sit there breathing, reflect on the blessings God has already provided, starting with the gift of life and the ability to breathe.
